KARUNAKARAN SENSEI HAS LEFT US

Suffering from health problems since several years, Draeger Sensei's main student in Malaysia, Karunakaran, died last month in Penang, an island North-West of Malaysia.

I have met personally K (as we used to call him among friends) in Summer 1976 during the seminars Draeger Sensei led every year (Penang, Ipoh, Seremban) in that country, and for which he had asked me to accompany him.

Since that year, I have kept close links with K. The EJF, in agreement with the IJF has organized 5 international seminars in Malaysia (1979, 1982, 1985, 1991 and 2015). Our European Federation owes much to this country that has helped to keep international Jô alive in the 80s, especially after Draeger
